# What Is the Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Training Package?

- Resource for training/supporting outreach workers to improve 3 hygiene behaviors:
  - safe water use and storage
  - safe feces handling
  - hand washing
- Three components:
  - Part I: Guide for **Training** Outreach Workers
  - Part II: Outreach Workers Handbook
  - Part III: Collection of Resource Materials
- Designed from a global perspective, but is customizable



# How Was the WASH Training Package Developed?

- Extensive review of existing materials
- Taking best practices from existing materials
- First draft produced
- Expert review
- Field tests
  - Zambia (ChildFund International) and
  - Southern Sudan (Medair)
- Final draft produced
- Final edits/layout and production
- Global release October 2009



# Who Should Use the WASH Training Package?

- Program managers of community-based programs
  - Currently doing WASH activities or
  - Want to add WASH to activities
- Trainers seeking a step-by-step guide for training outreach workers in WASH
- Type of organizations:
  - International NGOs
  - Local NGOs
  - CBOs, FBOs
  - Governments



## Part I: Guide for Training Outreach Workers

- For trainers
- Uses adult-learning principles
- Participatory techniques
- Train in skills rather than simply knowledge
- Modular to allow flexibility in use

## SESSION AT A GLANCE: How to Wash Our Hands

🕛 35 minutes

Activity	Time	Materials
A. Introduction	5 minutes	- Flipchart, tape, markers - Poster
Trainer introduces the topic of hand		- I Oster
washing and presents the objectives.		
B. Climate Setter	5 minutes	- Two drawings: dirty hands and clean hands
Trainer, using drawings, gets the		
participants to think about dirty and clean hands.		
C. Demonstration 1	10 minutes	- Pitcher of water - Tub of water
Trainer shows dirty hands and correct washing procedures.		- Soap - Tub of mud
D. Demonstration 2	5 minutes	None
How hands can carry germs from one person to another.		
F. Reading, Drawing Conclusions, and Summary	10 minutes	<ul> <li>Outreach Worker's Handbook</li> <li>Prepared page with key points for summary</li> </ul>

- Each module broken into sessions
- Each session starts with "at a glance" chart for the trainer



- C. Demonstration One (10 minutes)
  - 1. Invite one volunteer to participate in an exercise without saying what that exercise will be.
  - Have the volunteer stand in front of the room so everyone can see him or her and have the volunteer put hands in the tub of mud that you have uncovered.
  - 3. Ask the volunteer to make sure that his/her hands are covered with mud.
  - 4. Then ask the volunteer to smell hands and say what it smells like.
  - Then ask the volunteer to look closely at his/her hands and describe the feeling of having dirty hands.
  - Again, so everyone can see and follow along, have the volunteer wash his/her hands as s/he would normally. Ask the participants to be sure to watch everything that the volunteer does.
  - 7. Now ask the volunteer to describe how his/her hands smell and feel.
  - Then ask the participants to tell you what steps the volunteer followed during the hand washing.
  - Record these on a flipchart. Have a discussion about what they might do differently from what the volunteer did while washing: "Which steps might be missing?" "What would you do differently?"

 Step-by-step instructions for each activity or exercise






Trainer Note:

The idea here is to have a list of steps for hand washing generated by the volunteer and the participants, which you can then compare with the poster. The end product will be a "corrected" list of steps generated first with input from the participants and the volunteer and then supplemented with information from the poster and facilitator.

- Trainer's notes throughout guide
- Ensure clarity ("cheat sheet")
- Streamline the formatting







# What the WASH Training Package is <u>NOT</u>?

- It is <u>NOT</u> a program guide
  - Not a resource for creating a hygiene program
  - It is a resource for training outreach workers
- It is <u>NOT</u> a resource for all hygiene activities
  - Only covers safe water use and storage, safe feces handling and hand washing
- It is <u>NOT</u> a training guide for WASH activities for schools
- BUT, → Collection of Resource Materials <u>CAN</u> direct you to info on:
  - program development
    -- other hygiene practices
    - WASH in schools
